❖ AUSTRALIA



How amazing is the Lord! I was sitting at the bar in a club house that I go to. We talked about long rides and the President of the club said could I come for a ride with them. So I took an opportunity to go with them and what a great time we had on the road. One of the bikes had a problem, rubbing through on the ignition box. The bike got towed, an ignition box was found and given to the owner of the bike.

We done about 650 klms and had about 250 klms to go on the first leg of the ride. By this the sky was looking like rain and it did, getting on dark. It was an overnight stay at the club, barbecue, tea and bacon and eggs

and sausages for breakfast. Later, it was a short run to the city clubhouse and a decision was made which way they were going; it was decided it was the coast road that they would travel. That was our first 1000 klms done. We set out for the city for what was about 600 klms that day to a place call Coaftharber. It rained most of the way. We went to a motel for the night. Some of the members got new tyres and I got a shield for my helmet and off we went again in the wet weather. We eventually got to the clubhouse. By this time we had done over 2000 klms. I got well greeted by different members, had a feed and a couple of drinks, stayed awhile and went off to surprise my sister, who I hadn't seen in a while. Next morning it was back to the clubhouse for a ride with the members down the coast and the cops made their presence known. But I just kept riding along at about 280 klms. I found it a bit too cold for my legs and was not able to continue with the club on the ride.

While at the fuel stop I got to talk to a young missionary who had been working with youth in Thailand. I went back to my sister's place, caught up with family and Saturday I went to see Neil from God Squad CMC. I had some fellowship with him and he gave me a dry rider jacket as I had lost my dry-as-a-bone jacket on the run and only had a denim jacket the whole journey. When I left my sister's place it was fine and then the rain turned up again. We went to a place called Gundywindy where we had a feed and rest and decided to ride a little further to a place called Moony and slept under the awning of an old service station. From there I went to a place called Saint George and went to church there, had a chat and a bite to eat. We were on our way to Roma and Springshaw and Clearmount for the night and stayed at Wendy place for the night and home the next day. I had great time. If I went again I would be better prepared for the ride.

All I can say is that I was blessed. On the 12 of October I went to a custom car and bike show and had a great time there, didn't leave till late. Keep riding for Jesus because that is what it's all about - Jesus!

In the process of graffiti removal approximately two years ago, I was directed to a site which exemplified great graffiti style art. I posted an invitation, "For permission walls & sites please contact me "along with my business card. Over the course of a year the artists contacted me to ensure this wasn't a trap. After several meetings, with property owners, sponsors, and supportive members of the art community, the first murals began. The local media caught wind of the product, and featured a story about the team of young artists willing to step into the realm of legitimate murals. It was apparent this group was visual learners. So in preparation for the mural at the Heaven's Saints Motorcycle Ministry building in Harrow On., we met to view Barry Mason's testimony and the movie "Fallen Angel". From this, the images were derived, along with their "crew tag". They incorporated expressions concerning, second chances, making a change of direction (a.k.a. repentance), showing respect for the saving power of Christ. During the production I believe God's grace was demonstrated by the blending of sub-cultures, once involved in illegal activities to a change of heart demonstrated in taking a life changing step of faith.

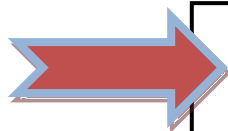

About two weeks before the nationals I get a letter that my time on unemployment was up. Went to the nationals not knowing what was going to happen when I got home. About 2 weeks after that I get a call from my friend and his wife, work is looking for a warehouse man to start in a week. COOL! Took the job, the pay is bad like I got 25 dollars more that I was making on unemployment but it's close to home and I need to work. About three weeks in I got a dollar raise. Praise GOD! It's starting to look better now. Been there for about a month and a half and I am happy to have a job with good people and I look back and I was so close to being homeless and GOD has never let me go hungry or not have a roof over my head. I give him all the praise and glory, without HIM I am nothing. Well that's what's been happing to me but all and all GOD is a good GOD and faithful too. Keep me in your prayers.

What I have learned this last year is a blessing to me, so if you don't see me on Facebook know that I am seeing JESUS face, not some face on Facebook ! I know now that I may not be where I think I need to be, but I know I am where GOD wants me to be. I may be hard headed but I am learning. 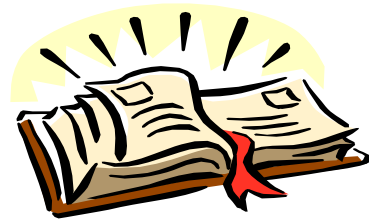
